

INTRODUCTION

Box Cutter Reliefs

If you cut regular shapes into paper with a box cutter or craft knife, you can then fold the shapes to create a fascinating paper relief that looks three-dimensional due to the effect of light and shadow.

DON'T BE AFRAID TO USE A CRAFT KNIFE!

If you stick to the following rules when cutting, hardly anything can happen:





When cutting, do not press the blade too hard and always move it away from your body.

Always use the removable provision at the end of the craft knife or box cutter to break off a blunt blade.

HOW TO MAKE IT

Select a cutting design, print it out and cut out the square along the solid line.

Carefully cut the lines with the box cutter or craft knife. Use cardboard or a cutting mat as a base!




Flip the sheet over and then slightly fold the cut out shapes upward.

The box cutter reliefs look especially beautiful when glued on top of different colored paper.



HOW TO MAKE IT



Cut out the square cutting sheet along the solid line.



Carefully cut the lines with the craft knife. Use a cutting mat!

Flip the sheet over and evenly press the cut out shapes upward.
