## INTRODUCTION

# WARM AND COLD COLORS

Through the process of seeing, colors are transformed into sensations and feelings. The tones ranging from yellow through orange to red, including brown, are what we call 'warm' colors. Warm colors remind us of warm sunlight and heat, which triggers a pleasant 'warm' feeling in the viewer. Blue tones and bluish-green tones with their gradations, on the other hand, are called 'cold' colors. The 'cool' perception of cold colors is most likely based on associations with bluish-green ice and seawater. Our experience tells us that snow, ice, and blue glaciers are cold.



In these materials, the phenomenon of warm and cold colors is represented pictorially with the help of a tree. The tree is drawn onto a grid and the tree crown has a circular shape. The squares in the tree crown are colored in using various warm colors such as yellow, orange, ocher, and red. The background squares, on the other hand, are colored in using various cool colors such as blues and greens.

This cold-warm color contrast is one of the most emotional and expressive, and because of this it radiates a particular charm. Awesome!!!

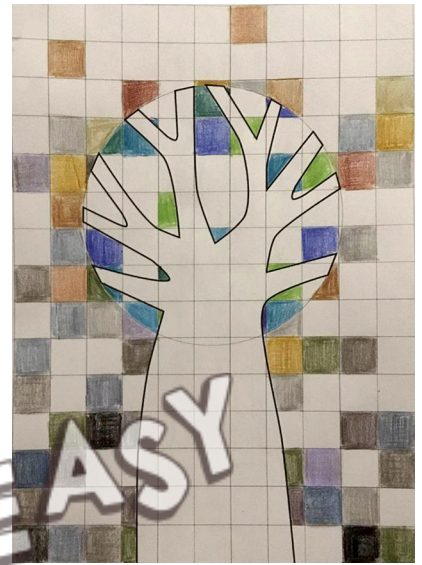

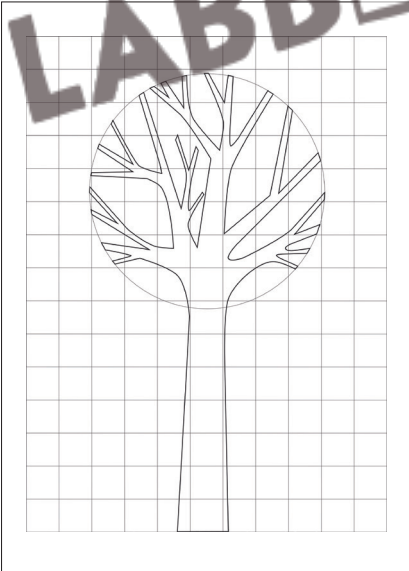

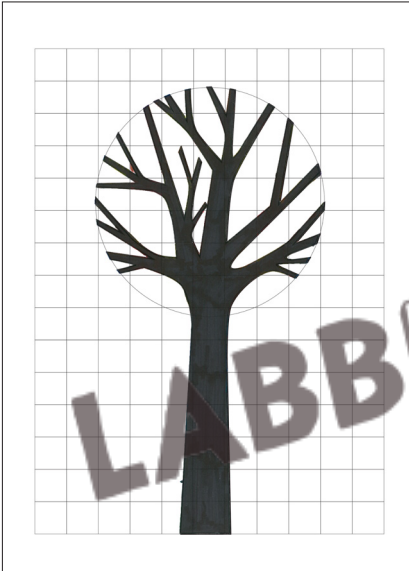
# Grid Trees

1



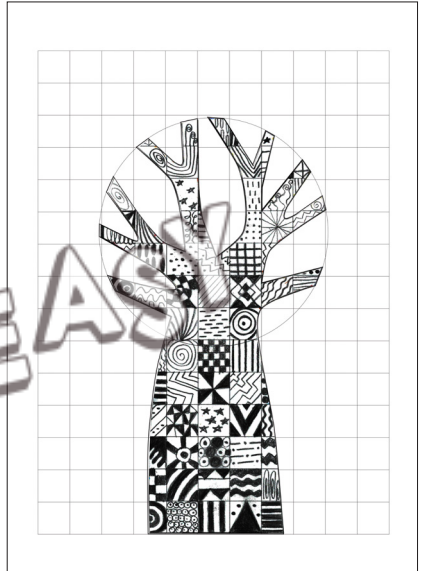
Print out the desired template on white paper or printing card.

2



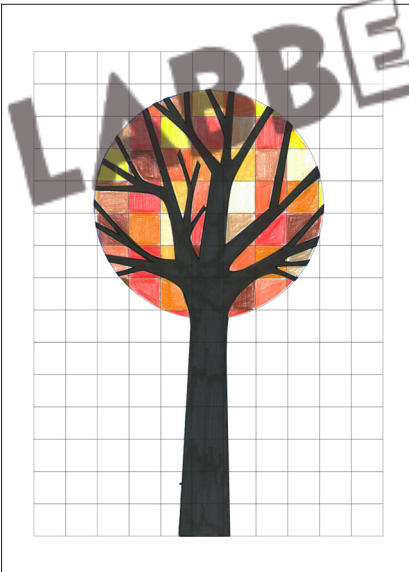
You can color in the tree trunk on the template with the narrow trunk in a dark color.

3



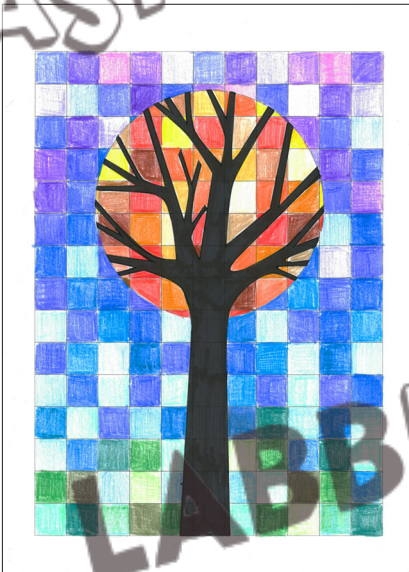
You can fill in the tree trunk on the template with the wide trunk with doodles. Pencils or fine markers work well for this.

Color in the circle of the tree crown using warm colors such as yellow, orange, and red.

5



Color in the background with cool colors: Blue tones in the upper area and green tones in the lower part.

6



Cut the picture out along the outer edge of the grid.
