

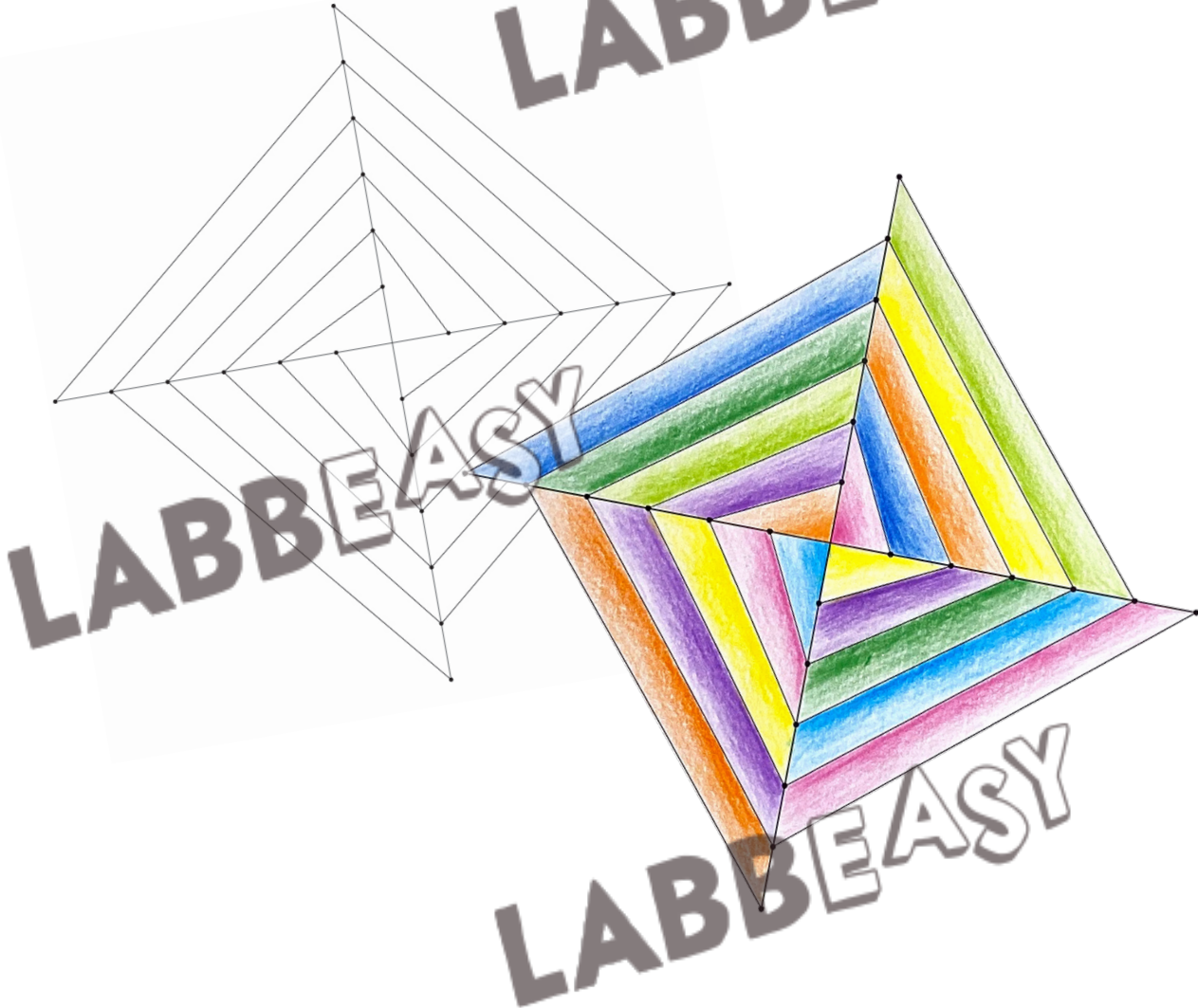

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INTRODUCTION

Drawing with Rulers

There are many straight lines in math. Most children can draw a straight line at 24 months old. But when it comes to math, it's important to be accurate. We do this by using a ruler. Drawing with a ruler is not very difficult, but connecting two points with a line requires patience and concentration.



In these 18 drawing templates, points are connected one after another with a ruler, either traced or drawn independently, to form rotationally symmetrical images. This requires a precise use of a ruler and a clean line using a sharp pencil. This particularly fun work with a ruler helps train fine motor skills.

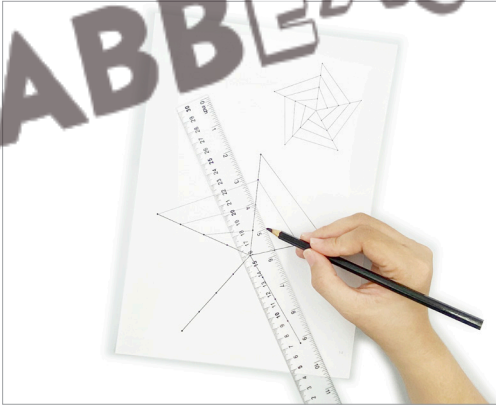
After drawing, the pictures can be colored with any colors using colored pencils.

HOW TO DO IT

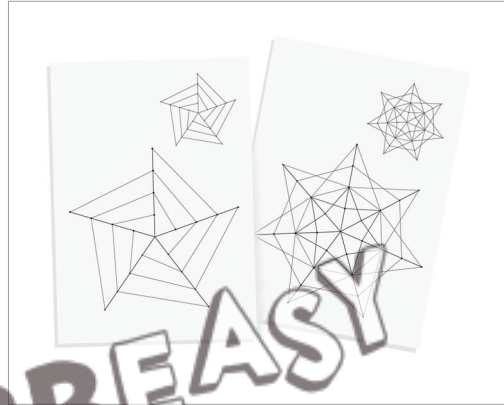
Drawing with Rulers

Print out any template that you like. Create the image using the guide in the upper right corner. Use a ruler and pencil to connect the dots.

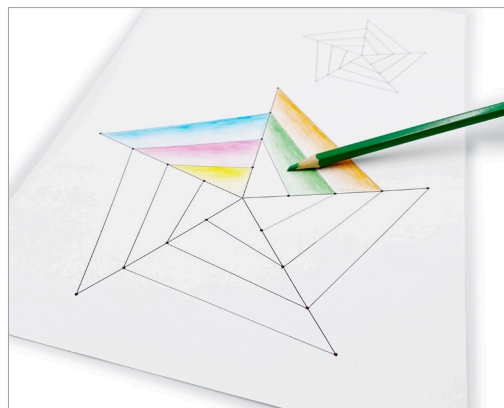
Once all the dots are connected as shown, you can start coloring.

You can color these pictures simply with ordinary colored pencils. The pictures shown here were colored with a shading technique. This creates a deliberate glow effect. To do this, hold the colored pencil like a normal pencil and move it back and forth or even in a circle. Light pressure creates lighter colors, strong pressure creates darker colors.

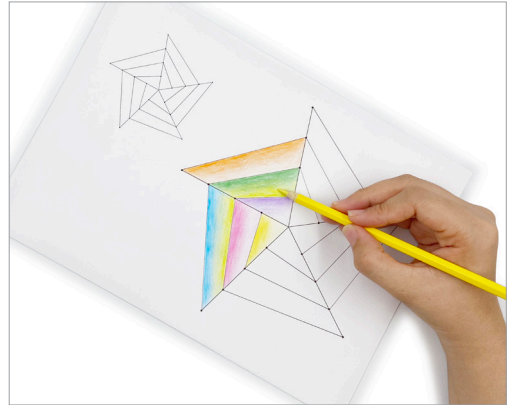
When you place the colored pencil on the paper at an angle and use the flat side of the tip to color, this is called shading. This technique of shading creates a certain depth to your picture.

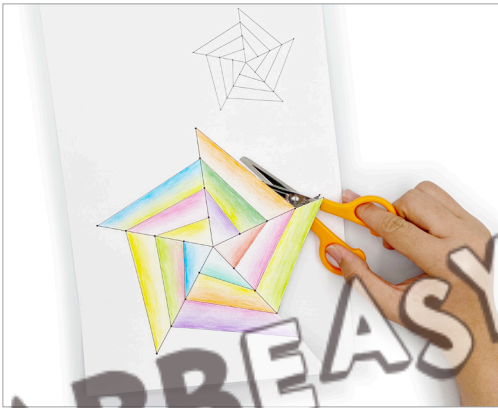
Another option is to lightly go over the areas you colored with an eraser. You could also sharpen your colored pencil and rub the shavings on your picture with your finger.

You can enhance the glow effect by layering a light color over a darker color.
