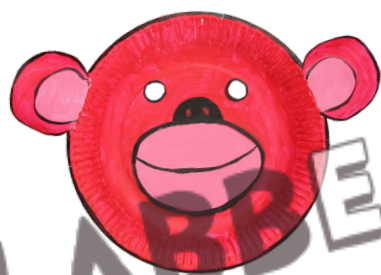

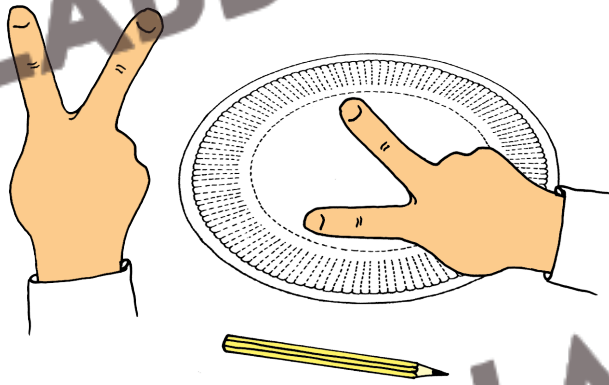

TIPS & SUGGESTIONS

Paper Plate Animal Masks

EYE DISTANCE



There's a trick for measuring the distance between your eyes: spread your index finger and middle finger as wide as possible, put them down on the mask and mark the spots where your fingertips are.

ATTACHING THE ELASTIC



Using a hole punch is the best way to make holes for the elastic. A bradawl (pointed hand-tool) will also do the trick!

MASK ON A STICK



The paper masks are also great attached to a stick. Lay your finished mask face-side up on a four-sided stick and attach it with drawing pins.
