



INTRODUCTION

Dinosaur-ABC

A for Ankylosaurus... B for Brachiosaurus... C for Coelophysis... Even four-year-olds remember six-syllable dinosaur names and enthusiastically collect facts about them: The velociraptor was a carnivore and was 1.5 to two meters long. It lived in the Cretaceous period, which was about 85 to 76 million years ago.

In any case, this specialized knowledge requires a high level of attention and a greater capacity to process information, which is what we want to encourage!



HOW TO DO IT


My First Book




Prepare all the pictures: Fold every left-hand edge over to meet the edge of the picture exactly. Score the folds with your fingernail.




First put glue on the fold of the last picture, using a piece of paper to protect the picture if needed. Lay the next page on top.



Stand the stacked pages on their vertical edge on the table to align the edges. Holding tightly to the right side, lay them down again and press the lefthand folds firmly together.



Glue all the picture pages together in this way. Put glue on the fold of the last picture and lay the title page on top.



Repeat step three and press the title page firmly to the glued fold. The left-hand edge of the title page will stand proud of the folded edge. Leave to dry briefly!



Fold and carefully glue the proud edge of the title page onto the rear side of your book. Score the edge. You can assemble your book either before or after coloring it in. LABBEAST
