## About Monkiri akura

Monkiri Sakura are Japanese paper cutouts that depict five-petaled cherry blossoms in an infinite number of variations. Monkiri Sakura is composed of the following two terms:

#### Sakura

Sakura (Japanese for cherry blossom) is one of the most well-known symbols in Japan. The Cherry blossom has been revered for centuries in Japan and is the nation's national flower. Since it blooms for only a short time, it symbolizes beauty and transience. The different stages of the blossom are said to remind people of the transience of beauty and life. The transience of the cherry blossom is a popular theme that always appears in wistful and melancholic poems and songs. When the cherry trees go into bloom, it means that spring is back, and everyone goes to the parks to admire them.



#### Monkiri

Monkiri is the traditional Japanese art of folding and cutting paper. Mon are Japanese heraldic images or family characters and kiri means 'cut'. Most Japanese coats of arms are monochrome, depict stylized plants or animals, and are often outlined by a circle. For example, the sixteen-petaled chrysanthemum is the emblem of the Japanese emperor and also the national coat of arms. There are over 10,000 different signs such as this in Japan, which have been passed down from generation to generation.

The timeless clarity and unique aesthetic of these ancient Japanese motifs still fascinates today. Even small children can cut out complicated Monkiri shapes if you fold the paper for them beforehand. The subsequent unfolding then has a real wow-effect!

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
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


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Fold the paper once diagonally, so tha the design is folded down. Lay out the piece of paper as shown





Fold the piece of paper along the short line to the left so that both edges are on top of each other.



Fold the left tip back-ward along the dotted



Cut out the design and carefully unfold it.
