MATERIALS

2 carboard-rolls, card offcuts, beads, orange wool, glue, poster paint, brush, water pot, scissors




HOW TO DO IT





Cut 1/2 inch (1 cm) deep slots into a card roll all around one end and push out the resulting tabs. Cut a second roll in half and glue it to the tabs. Paint the fox orange. Glue on a tail made from twisted wool.



Cut out legs and ears from colored or hand-painted cardboard and a white triangle for the nose. Glue all the parts to the body. Then glue two beads onto the face for eyes and one bead for the tip of the nose.

BEAR

Brown bear, polar bear, panda – bears from all over the world are getting together for the big bear-moot!

MATERIALS

Carboard-rolls, card and paper offcuts, glue, poster paint, brush, water pot, scissors, felt-tip pen



HOW TO DO IT



Paint a card roll with gouache or poster paints. Mix the gouache paints with a little water. Cut out arms, legs, and ears from card you've painted white, brown or black.



Draw the snout on white paper, cut it out and glue the arms, legs and snout onto the now-dried cardboard roll. Draw on the eyes, mouth, and nose. Cut a slot into each ear and slide them onto the top of the card roll.
