Joan Miró (1893-1983)

Catalan artist Joan Miró was a painter, graphic artist, sculptor and ceramist. He's best known for his surrealistic and imaginative pictorial motifs. His symbols of the sun, moon, stars, birds, eyes and women are among the most famous elements of his art. In terms of the content, he was dedicated to the relationship between man and nature. "One thing merges into the other. Everything forms one unit. There is no domain that is different to others. Everything is connected." (Joan Miró).

Joan Miró and Pablo Picasso were linked by a lifelong friendship. Both had emigrated from Spain to Paris where they met for the first time in 1920. "After me, it is you who will open new doors (...)" Pablo Picasso ennobled him. Vibrant colors and simplified forms are characteristic of Miró, as is his pictorial homage to Picasso, created the year before Picasso's death.
