



HOW TO DO IT

Folding Pictures

When you make folded cut-outs it's always astonishing how expressive graphic effects can be achieved with very simple means. Cutting and folding out the shapes gives you an amazing pictorial result - the folded forms become symmetrical mirror-images. Folding pictures are brought to life through contrast, that is from the interaction between the black and white surface areas or between the dark and light shapes – between positive and negative. The main rule for folding cut-outs is: Nothing may be taken away and nothing added.


White and black card are best suited for first attempts. Once you have some experience, you can also work with colored card or paper. Simple picture shapes have a fantastic effect when you put them together to make larger, complex pictures. Folding pictures are particularly suitable for group work.





Choose a folding-picture template and print it out on white paper.










Carefully cut out the template following the lines. Don't throw anything away!





Place the cut-out outer part on the right-hand half of a black or colored sheet of card and fold the patterned shape over to the left.








Put glue on the shapes and stick them on.

Suggestions for Group Projects

Folding pictures are great for group work, since they look especially impressive when you display them all together.



The contrasting folding pictures also look great on colored paper or card.
